Mobile devices like smartphones and tablets are becoming pervasive and ubiquitous in the society, structuring the private, business and educational communication framework. These trends put tremendous pressure on high schools, colleges, and universities not yet ready to use these devices as powerful communication tools within education.

Sør-Trøndelag University College has recently lead 6 international European pilot projects, addressing how to effectively use mobile devices into teaching and learning processes. Similarly, Lomonosov Moscow State University during the last 2 years has led several Russian projects regarding mobile learning and mobile technologies.

The workshop is going to use hands-on training and demonstrate state of the art tools and methods that have been developed and used in Norway and Russia, including:

- Enhancement of class interactivity and communication processes through online response systems
- New assessment for learning methods that use immediate feedback to turn tests and exams into a creative learning activity
- Strategies for inclusion of mobile technologies into teaching practices, and development of new international research, development and innovation projects
